



CSI P – CSI YP FONTAINEBLEAU (FRA) 5th May – 8th May 2023

For 2023, results of the Showjumping Ireland Equijump.ltd Spring Tour will be used to allocate place for Fontainebleau

The following selection system will apply:

- o The CSIYP (6-year-old) must have been seen on the Equijump.ltd Spring Tour on at least three occasions at any leg of the tour and have attained two first round clears in the 1.10m class.
- o The CSIYP (7-year-old) must have been seen on the Equijump.ltd Spring Tour on at least three occasions at any leg of the tour and have attained two first round clears in the 1.20m .
 - The additional CSIYP Ponies must be approved by the Team Manager as being of sufficient standard to compete in Fontainebleau.

RANKING SYSTEM CSIP (10 Combinations)

- The top 10 ranked combinations from the 1.20m rankings will qualify for the CSIP competition by the SJI Pony Committee.
- Each combination's three lowest total fault scores from the first round in each 1.20m class will count towards their overall ranking for the allocation of CSIP places. At least two of the fault scores must be zero.
- In the event of tied fault totals, the combinations finishing position in the second round of the 1.20m class at Portmore 16th April will determine their final ranking.
- Any combination who does not compete at Portmore 16th April will be considered to have finished behind those who did compete in the final leg for the purposes of resolving tied fault totals.
- Any combination can compete Hors Concours (HC) in the spring tour and still be ranked for Fontainebleau selection purposes. This enables them to remain within the RDS 2023 points thresholds.

RANKING SYSTEM CSIYP (10 combinations)

- The 10 top ranked combinations from their respective classes will be eligible for quota allocation in the Fontainebleau CSIYP competitions by the SJI Pony Committee.
- 6-year-old ponies are eligible for allocation in the CSIYP 6-year-old classes through the Spring Tour 1.10m rankings only.
- 7-year-old ponies are eligible for allocation of a place through the 1.20m rankings but may only

compete in the CSIYP 7-year-old classes in Fontainebleau.

- Each combination's three lowest total fault scores from the first round in each of their respective classes will count towards their overall ranking for the allocation of CSIYP places. At least two of the fault scores must be zero

- In the event of tied fault totals, the combinations finishing position in the second round of their respective classes at Portmore 16th April will determine their final ranking.

- Any combination who does not compete at Portmore 16th April will be considered to have finished behind those who did compete in the final leg for the purpose of resolving tied fault totals.

- A combination can compete Hors Concours (HC) in the spring tour and still be ranked for Fontainebleau selection purposes. This enables them to remain within the RDS 2023 points threshold.

- Athletes should note that the SJI Pony Committee reserves the right not to allocate CSIYP places, notwithstanding the ranking of such athlete combination.

Veterinary Obligations and Pony Measuring

- All Ponies intending on travelling for the CSIP and CSIYP are required to have a valid FEI Pony Measurement, FEI Recognition Card and 2023 FEI Pony Registration together with up-to-date vaccinations. Please contact Brid Marron bmarron@horsesportireland.ie Direct Line: +353 45854506

- Athletes, personal management teams, private coaches are to ensure that the equine passports are up-to-date vaccinations and/or flu boosters as required

Horses competing at FEI Events must comply with the requirements for Equine Influenza vaccination in accordance with the Veterinary Regulations and as summarised below.

VACCINATION	PROTOCOL	ELIGIBILITY TO ENTER VENUE
Primary Course	1 st Vaccination: day 0 2 nd Vaccination: day 21-92	May compete 7 days after the 2 nd Vaccination
First Booster	Within 7 months of the 2 nd vaccination of the Primary Course	May compete for 6 months +21 days after the 2 nd vaccination of the Primary Course Must not compete in the 7 days after receiving a vaccination
Boosters	MINIMUM: within one year of previous booster vaccination IF COMPETING: must be in the 6 months +21 days of the booster previous vaccination	Must have been vaccinated within 6 months +21 days before arriving at the Event Must not compete in the 7 days after receiving a vaccination

All FEI registered Horses intending to compete at FEI Events (including CIMs) must be vaccinated against Equine Influenza in accordance with these VRs. The exception being if the applicable domestic legislation prevents the use of Equine Influenza vaccines within the relevant territory

Before Departure

Selected combinations require a FEI Athlete Licence, FEI Pony Registration and FEI Recognition Card in order to compete in Fontainebleau. Please contact Brid Marron bmarron@horsesportireland.ie Direct Line: +353 45854506
